EASTER FEAR

Easter- the time of life, of power, of grace and glory! It's the most important day of the Christian year, when we proclaim that life has triumphed over death, and love has triumphed over hate, and hope shall forever triumph over despair. Which is a wondrous, awesome and heady proclamation.

So why, right after Easter in the scripture, do the disciples seem so... pitiful? They hide up in their upper room, afraid to open the door. Jesus Himself comes to them and they nearly lose their shorts! And then when they tell Thomas about what they've experienced, he says, "As if" (actually he says, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands... and put my hand in His side, I will not believe.")

Why are they so pitiful? Because they are afraid. They don't understand what is happening to them, and the world around them is crashing into a chaotic, dizzying whirl. And all they can do is shut their eyes and shake their heads, and hope it will all go away.

Sometimes I feel like that. The world seems to be crumbling into a gladiator's arena of tyrants and megalomaniacs, strapping on their nuclear armors and nationalist jingos. From Russia to China, to Eastern Europe to Western Europe, to the Americas (not to mention the Middle East and Africa), violent and totalitarian impulses are raging rampant. And I (we?) want to shut our eyes and shake our heads and hope it will all go away.

But that's not what Easter calls us to do. Easter cries out, "Oh death, where is your victory! O death, where is your sting!" (1 Corinthians 15:56) Easter calls us to lift our heads and look for the Risen Christ. Look at the broken places to see where life is breaking through nevertheless.

Audre Lorde, a cancer survivor and LGBT activist, wrote these memorable words:

"When I dare to be powerful- to use my strength in the service of my vision, then it becomes less and less important whether I am afraid.

And when Barbara Harris was being ordained as the first woman bishop in the Episcopal church, she was given this charge:

"Don't fear the difficulty of the task before you; just remember the strength of the Power behind you."

This is the power of Easter- the power of God that no earthly power will be able to overcome. The power that is in us, as God's resurrection people. Amen!



The kiosk in the church foyer has drawers

- Grocery receipts from Albrecht's Sentry store in Delafield. We receive a rebate of the total receipts we submit. Those rebates help our bottom line!
- Empty printer ink cartridges either go to Dousman Elementary or are turned in at Office Max to earn credit for any Emmanuel purchases.
- First Aid items/new toothbrushes/OTC pain meds (unopened) are given to the Free Clinic in Oconomowoc.
- Used cellphones and chargers are sold on eBay with proceeds benefiting our bottom line.
- Used eye glasses are given to the Dousman Lions Club: throughout the year, Lions, <u>Leos</u> and other volunteers collect used eyeglasses and deliver them to regional <u>Lions Eyeglass Recycling</u> <u>Centers (LERCs)</u>. LERC volunteers clean, sort by prescription strength and package the glasses.

Recycled glasses are distributed to people in need in low and middle income communities where they will have the greatest impact.

Also located in the foyer is our Food Pantry Bin. The first Sunday of each month is the designated day to bring donations of non-perishables & paper products for the Kettle Moraine Food Pantry. THANK YOU to Sharon Perez who faithfully loads your donations into her vehicle each month and takes them to the Pantry.
