Or you can bless homeless vets with basic life supplies (see below) and a note of encouragement. We'll be collecting these wrapped gifts on Dec. 16, and taking them to the VA Hospital. Make a vet happy! Here is a note from the VA Chaplain:

" I just want to say thank you in advance from our Veterans who find themselves down and out. We average 35-50 in our Veteran homeless program at any time of whom 15-20 are female vets. They have some of the hardest times regaining their self-worth after being down and out. Our homeless program last from 6months to a year, with the goal to get the Veteran back into society and productive – but it starts with them having a renewed sense of well-being and pride in self. Thanks again for your kindness.

- **Our homeless female veterans need soaps, shampoos, conditioners, skin lotion, deodorants, toothpaste, toothbrushes, combs, hair brushes.**
- **Our homeless male veterans can use disposable razors, shaving cream or powder, foot powder, Gold Bond products, toothpaste, toothbrushes, deodorant, combs, shampoo, soap.**
- **All our veterans need socks, footies, mittens, gloves, scarves; hard candies go over better than chocolate.**
- **No alcohol:** The only things in toiletries that we cannot give them is anything with alcohol in it – colognes, after shaves, and even mouthwash (which has a high alcohol content).

(Note: There will be no mitten tree this year in the Sanctuary-just the Angel Tree in the Gathering Area.)

Our next opportunity to host Family Promise guests will begin January 13.


Kiosk Collections

The kiosk in the church foyer has drawers labeled for different things we collect on an ongoing basis. It's a great way to get rid of unneeded items and help out at the same time:

- Grocery receipts from Albrecht's Sentry store in Delafield. We receive a rebate of the total receipts we submit. Those rebates help our bottom line!
- Empty printer ink cartridges are turned in at Office Max to earn credit for Emmanuel purchases.
- First Aid items/new toothbrushes/OTC pain meds (unopened) are given to the Free Clinic in Oconomowoc.
- Used cell phones and chargers are sold on eBay with proceeds benefiting our bottom line.
- Used eye glasses are given to the Dousman Lions Club: throughout the year, Lions, Leos and other volunteers collect used eyeglasses and deliver them to regional Lions Eyeglass Recycling Centers (LERCs). LERC volunteers clean, sort by prescription strength and package the glasses. Recycled glasses are distributed to people in need in low and middle income communities where they will have the greatest impact.
- Cell phones & chargers, if appropriate, are sold on Ebay by Bill Welch with the proceeds going to Emmanuel's general fund.

Dear EUCC Community, the seedling you rooted in summer is now in its first fall season. Since you planted us we have had programs about dogs that heal prisoner's broken spirits; about the meaning of Halloween; about the Cherry Tree Carol and how the cherry trees

got to Washington, DC. We have had a campfire meditation and a tree blessing. We have looked at silk screen art with powerful soul messages and Native American traditions with magnificent Spirit prayers. We have enjoyed a presentation about Ethical Chocolate and created a Short Story kind of Parable for teamwork. We have made new friends in the Permaculture world and in the Dousman Farmer's Market. We have enjoyed ethical chocolate pudding and organic popcorn; mushroom stroganoff and ginger squash soup; super summer salads and fall vegetable medleys; honey-baked apples and pumpkin pie. We've communed over a rich selection of home-made breads. We are becoming that farm-to-table dinner community where people make spiritual connections together. And we could not do any of this without the core kitchen and Common Room where we can gather in peace and security; knowing that diverse voices will be heard and respected. We are growing in care for each other and we ask for your prayers that we can grow our love larger, especially as winter approaches and most drive some distance


