Singing Bowl for JANUARY and beyond...

The Singing Bowl for January and February will go to Women's Literacy and the establishment of women's

businesses in Serbia through Church World Service. Women are largely the stable center of families in need, and their success means the success of their children. Let your spare change make a difference in the lives of Serbian women and their families!

The Singing Bowl for March and April will go to the establishment of water sources and wells in South Sudan. Many living in remote areas have to walk hours every day just to find a water source, which is often contaminated water bearing diseases. Since its inception in 2003, Water For South Sudan has drilled 349 wells, with the capacity to serve 600 people. In 2018, they completed their first latrine at a primary school in Way, serving 800 students.

Kiosk Collections

The kiosk in the church foyer has drawers labeled for different things we collect on an ongoing basis. It's a great way to get rid of unneeded items and help out at the same time:

- Grocery receipts from Albrecht's Sentry store in Delafield. We receive a rebate of the total receipts we submit. Those rebates help our bottom line!
- Empty printer ink cartridges are turned in at Office Max to earn credit for Emmanuel purchases.
- First Aid items/new toothbrushes/OTC pain meds (unopened) are given to the Free Clinic in Oconomowoc.
- Used eye glasses are given to the Dousman Lions Club:
 throughout the year, Lions, Leos and other volunteers
 collect used eyeglasses and deliver them to
 regional Lions Eyeglass Recycling Centers (LERCs).
 LERC volunteers clean, sort by prescription strength
 and package the glasses. Recycled glasses are
 distributed to people in need in low and middle
 income communities where they will have the
 greatest impact.

Council Highlights December 16th meeting

- Beginning February 17, 2019 our worship services will be more friendly to people who are experiencing dementia. Please plan to attend the January 13th training session that will be held following worship. The Waukesha County ADRC will get the word out that Emmanuel is a dementia-friendly community!
- We will once again have cookies available with our Sunday coffee in the gathering area. They will be on a hidden shelf on the coffee tray and the ushers will take them out if we do not have Prader-Willi guests with us that Sunday. If we do have PW guests, no cookies will be served.
- A Mystery Dinner has been tentatively scheduled for March 23rd. The script has been purchased and dinner plans will soon be underway. This will be a fundraiser, so the congregants will be asked to sell tickets.
- Council members are seeking officers and board members for 2019.

- Our building is now over 20 years old and upgrades and repairs are on the horizon. At the January 2019 annual meeting Trustees will share information on how we hope to fund the projects.
- Another idea for a fundraiser was presented...a
 Christmas Cookie Walk. Other churches have wild
 success with this, but it would take LOTS of cookie
 baking, likely throughout the year (and freezing until
 December). More information will be shared as plans
 are discussed and developed.
- A New Common Ground is hoping to increase their visibility by holding a fundraising event in 2019. A Vision Team will also be formed.

LET'S MAKE EMMANUEL A DEMENTIA-FRIENDLY CHURCH!



Over and over again, we have striven to open ourselves to ALL of God's people.

We are being given another opportunity to open our hearts! People with dementia have special needs that we might not immediately think of. When a person with Alzheimer's sees a dark rug going into a light tile floor (like our front entry), they will often stop and refuse to go over it. Why? Because it looks like an abyss. It looks like if they step from the light tile into that dark space, they will fall into a hole. Who would have thought?

In February, we would like to open our doors as the only Dementia-Friendly Church in Waukesha County. At this point, there just aren't any other churches who have consciously, intentionally made it comfortable for people with dementia to attend. But to do this, we need to know what it takes to be a dementia-friendly congregation.

SUNDAY, JANUARY. 13 AFTER WORSHIP, WE'LL HAVE A DEMENTIA-FRIENDLY TRAINING by Randy Kohl, the Dementia Care Specialist for Waukesha County. We need **EVERYONE** to participate, so we can open our doors to people with dementia.

ESPECIALLY, WE NEED ALL THE GREETERS AND USHERS TO BE THERE, SINCE IT WILL BE YOU WHO HAS THE FIRST CONTACT WITH OUR GUESTS. But not just the Ushers and Greeters, it's important that our Communion Assistants be trained as well. In fact, we ALL need to know what to do if one of our guests runs into trouble.

Waukesha County, through the ADRC, will begin to advertise us as a Dementia-Friendly congregation in February, when we hope to open our doors to this ministry.

So, look forward to Feb. 17 as our kick-off date!
