#### Life After Easter

How do we talk about Easter? Renewal. Revival. Rebirth. We speak of a new season, a new growth, a new life. We smell the sap rising in the trees, and hear the singing of nestlings, and feel the warmth and lengthening of days. We even hear that love is stronger than death.

But is that all? When the Mary Magdalene and the other women came to the tomb on Easter morning, what changed their lives? It wasn't spring flowers and butterflies, or even baby bunnies. It was an empty tomb, and then... a risen Savior. Alive. Living, breathing, speaking, eating, eternally and forever ALIVE!

"Go quickly," the angel said to the women, "Go quickly and tell the disciples, 'He has risen from the dead, and is going ahead of you to Galilee. There you will see Him..." (Matthew 28:7)

This is the basis of our faith: Jesus lives, and so shall I; Death thy sting is gone forever. This is the basis of our hope for the world: Jesus lives, and nothing shall overcome God's purpose in Christ: not even death itself.

To be honest, this is not something I can get my mind around. I don't claim to understand the resurrection any more than I understand the mystery of God becoming flesh and living among us. It is beyond me. And yet, by God's grace it is also within me... not the <a href="idea">idea</a> of the Resurrection, but the very fact of it. Life has overcome death in the breast of God. You and I are held by God, and God cherishes us, and will never let us go.



## Council Highlights from the March 17th Meeting

- Jim Langreder attended the meeting asking for Emmanuel's support in his pursuit of ordination in the UCC. The Council, acting as a Discernment Committee gave the approval. The next step is for Jim to work with the Church & Ministry portion of the SE WI Association. His plan is to do his studies online at Chicago Theological Seminary. He has no plan to leave his position as our Minister of Music.
- In response to congregational feedback, Council has scheduled a session on Sunday, May 5 to allow members and friends to share their thoughts and ideas for the betterment of Emmanuel. There will be no staff present at this session (see the Announcing Speak Up article in this newsletter).
- Pastor Nansi requested vacation to visit her daughter in Cleveland which Council approved. She will be gone April 12-16. Palm Sunday is April 14, however the service will consist of the Choir's Holy Week/Easter Cantata.
- The Council approved a \$100 donation to help the WI Conference UCC defray costs associated with hosting the hospitality portion of the General Synod meeting being held in Milwaukee in June.
- We have two furnaces that need replacing; however, Trustees has delayed this work until this fall

- (providing the furnaces keep functioning safely). Carbon Monoxide Detectors have been installed throughout the church to insure our safety.
- A separate savings account for the Capital Funds Campaign has been set up at Ixonia Bank.

Where there is life, there is love. Where there is love, there is the possibility of a wider embrace than many churches have ever known. But this kind of soil needs water too. WE NEED YOUR PRAYERS.

   to regional <u>Lions Eyeglass Recycling Centers (LERCs)</u>.
   LERC volunteers clean, sort by prescription strength
   and package the glasses. Recycled glasses are
   distributed to people in need in low and middle
   income communities where they will have the
   greatest impact.
