I Met Jesus And Things Didn't Get Better!!!

John 9:8-9- "The neighbors and those who had seen him before as a beggar began to ask, 'Is this not the man who used to sit and beg?' Some were saying, 'It is he.' Others were saying, 'No, but it is someone like him.' He kept saying, 'I am the man.'"

I read a devotional a number of years back by a pastor named Tony Robinson. I knew Tony back when I was a pastor in Seattle, where he also served. This meditation has always niggled at the back of my heart, and so now I'm going to let it niggle you as well.

"What happens to someone who is touched and changed by Jesus? When I watch a religious TV show or listen to some personal testimonies, it seems that after meeting Jesus everything is better. "Jesus came into my life and now business is great, my wife and I are super in love, and the kids, who were on drugs, are getting straight A's. Thank you, Jesus."

It may be that way for some people.

But I'm struck by what happened to the blind beggar, in John 9, who was touched and healed by Jesus. He got healed and his neighbors no longer knew him. His parents disowned him. And he was kicked out of the church. If he'd given a testimony it might have been, "Yes, I was healed by Jesus and my life turned into a mess. People I'd known for a long time acted as if they didn't know me, my family didn't want anything to do with me, and the authorities threatened to arrest me."

I imagine his testimony might continue. "Yes, since meeting Jesus my life is harder in many ways. But, you know, I wouldn't have it any other way. Because now I see. I see how afraid many people are, how afraid I was. Afraid to tell the truth, afraid to live, afraid to take any risks. It's like we're blind. It makes me sad. But I don't want to go back."

Being touched and blessed by Jesus may not mean our lives are suddenly successful, as society defines success. Jesus may make life harder, but in ways that matter. He gives us problems worth having. And when we experience hard things on his account, that is when we come to really know him.

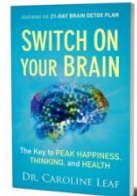

MISSIONS OF EMMANUEL



Emmanuel's next Family Promise hosting week begins Sunday, October 20th with set-up after worship and families arriving late that afternoon. Our classrooms will be converted into sleeping quarters and fellowship hall into the dining and entertainment room for the families and our wonderful volunteers will provide hot dinners each evening. Families will pack up and leave the following Sunday by 7 AM. Volunteers will be needed for set-up, providing evening meals, staying overnight (2 per night), and clean-up at 6:30 AM on Sunday, October 27. To be a Family Promise volunteer, it is necessary to attend a training session. For a schedule of upcoming training, please contact the office in Wales: 262-968-2321 or email

them at director@familypromisewaukesha.org. Our Emmanuel Family Promise Volunteer Coordinators are Charlotte Voigt and Sue Stelling.

Family Promise of Waukesha County is a non-profit organization that assists local homeless families and their children. Families are provided with overnight shelter, meals, and support services with the goal of achieving permanent housing and sustainable independence.

Our local host and support congregations provide families with meals and overnight shelter. Our Day Center provides one-on-one case management to create individual plans towards self-sufficiency, and connect them with existing community services to find job training, employment, daycare and affordable housing. **Families generally work through the program in 45-60 days.* Our Program Values:

~We believe in the dignity of all persons and that they should be treated with equality, respect and compassion.

~We believe in the potential for change and growth and that families with support and guidance, can determine their needs and future.

~We strive to be wise and effective stewards of all of our resources (finances, time, people, property).

~We believe in a holistic, creative and responsible approach as we collaborate with others to meet the needs of each family.

Family Promise of Waukesha County is an affiliate of the national organization Family Promise. We serve families with children without regard to race, religion, gender, or age.

Kiosk Collections

The kiosk in the church foyer has drawers labeled for different things we collect on an ongoing basis. It's a great way to get rid of unneeded items and help out at the same time:

- Grocery receipts from Albrecht's Sentry store in Delafield. We receive a rebate of the total receipts we submit. Those rebates help our bottom line!
- Empty printer ink cartridges are turned in at Office Max to earn credit for Emmanuel purchases.
- First Aid items/new toothbrushes/OTC pain meds (unopened) are given to the Free Clinic in Oconomowoc.
- Used cell phones and chargers are sold on eBay with proceeds benefiting our bottom line.
- Used eye glasses are given to the Dousman Lions Club: throughout the year, Lions, Leos and other volunteers collect used eyeglasses and deliver them to regional Lions Eyeglass Recycling Centers (LERCs). LERC volunteers clean, sort by prescription strength and package the glasses. Recycled glasses are distributed to people in need in low and middle income communities where they will have the greatest impact.
