


SOUPER BOWL SUNDAY February 2!!

Singing Bowlfor FEBRUARY Medical Debt Release

This past Dec. 3, almost 6,000 families on the South Side of Chicago had their medical debts forgiven through a collaborative effort of the UCC and other partners. Those church donations wiped out \$5.3 million in medical debts, by buying up the debt at pennies to the dollar. When medical debt piles up, families are faced with hard decisions: buying their food and shelter and allowing their debts to balloon, or cut back on necessities, even to the point of homelessness. In a 2008 Commonwealth Fund survey, "Seeing Red: The Growing Burden of Medical Bills and Debts Faced By U.S. Families," it was found that among millions of families ages 19-64 in the study, 39% reported using up all their savings because of medical bills. Families are forced to decide between their physical health and their financial health.

February's Singing Bowl will combine with the offerings of many other churches to release more people drowning in medical debt through this buyback program.

MISSIONS OF EMMANUEL



In January we hosted our first Family Promise rotation of the year. Emmanuel had three families, four adults and seven children, staying overnight the second week in January.

There will be three other weeks in 2020 that we volunteer for this wonderful mission of Emmanuel. Our church, along with volunteers from St. Mary's and St. Bruno's of Dousman provide meals and shelter for some of the homeless of Waukesha County but we are not the only church that has Family Promise as one of their missions. There are 12 other churches in our county that do the same. We only see a small percentage of the families that Family Promise serves. Here are some statistics from 2019, from the 13 churches that make up Family Promise of Waukesha County:

- 18 families were served
- there were 77 individuals of which 68% were children
- 2809 nights and 2809 hot meals were provided
- 61% of these families found suitable housing and 73% found income success

Sometimes we might question if our service is needed and effective. Just know that every night when our church hosts or supports a family, it is a success. It is a night a child is not sleeping in a car. It is a night that mom and dad can take a breath and know their child is safe. It is a night that families know someone cares for them in the moment. We become part of their success story. Thank you!

Kiosk Collections

The kiosk in the church foyer has drawers labeled for different things we collect on an ongoing basis. It's a great way to get rid of unneeded items and help out at the same time:

- Grocery receipts from Albrecht's Sentry store in Delafield. We receive a rebate of the total receipts we submit. Those rebates help our bottom line!
- First Aid items/new toothbrushes/OTC pain meds (unopened) are given to the Free Clinic in Oconomowoc.
- Used eye glasses are given to the Dousman Lions Club: throughout the year,
 Lions, <u>Leos</u> and other volunteers collect used eyeglasses and deliver them to regional Lions Eyeglass Recycling Centers (LERCs). LERC volunteers clean, sort by prescription strength and package the glasses. Recycled glasses are distributed to people in need in low and middle income communities where they will have the greatest impact.
