I have been thinking about our bodies. When we get sick or injured, how they fight to be well or whole. How we've been living in the midst of this pandemic, struggling to keep our bodies safe and to keep our neighbors safe. I've been thinking about what it means to live in my body, what it means to stay healthy, eat well, honor it, and how it feels when I don't. In the middle of a pandemic that affects how we take breath, where we go, and everything we touch, I've been thinking about our bodies.

We are been thinking about how important our bodies are. How they adjust when we are injured to continue to allow us to function, other muscles kick in, new neurons pathways are formed. Even as they are imperfect, they are miracles and they are important.

There are multitudes of ideas, concepts, beliefs, ways of being that we celebrate during Advent and Christmas. One of which is that God understood how important our bodies are, how important having form and touch and pain and pleasure were that God came in flesh and blood, tissues and neurons. God came as Jesus, lived among humanity, embodied.

I think that's part of what is making these days of quarantine so difficult, and what is going to make the holidays so difficult—we are embodied people who are created with the same desire for connection that lead God to come close and live among us, to engage in the tactile sensation of being part of creation. And we are living, in many ways, apart, disconnected, sometimes alone.

But we have a God who knows what it's like to be embodied, to have long nights alone with nothing but the desert for company, so exhausted not even a storm could keep sleep at bay, so grateful for touch without expectation that even a foot massage would do. Jesus, who lived in a body and understands why this season might be hard, because he's been there too.

May that give us hope, that our God knows what we are going through, knows our struggles, knows hopes, knows our joys, knows our sorrows. You are not alone this season, whether it is filled with joys or sorrows or, most likely, some combination. The God who comes near at Christmas is with you and so is your Emmanuel Church family.

Support Family Promise as our "Angel Tree" Project this year



What to expect this Advent and Christmas Season

With these less than usual times, Advent will look a bit different, however, we'll still be gathering, even if it is online.

You're invited to make your own Advent Wreath and light your candles with us each Sunday morning.

Every household will receive an Advent card, inviting you to reflect, pray, and act in new ways during this season.

Each Sunday School Family will receive an Advent bag,

On Wednesdays, we'll post music and readings.

On December 16th, we'll meet on Zoom for Blue Christmas—a service of grief and remembrance.

And on Christmas Eve (December 24th), we'll post a service of reading, song, and reflection. AND at our traditional service time of 5pm, we'll gathering in parking lot, again, to physically distant sing a couple of carols and light candles together. If you are able, please bring your own candles from home.

Council Meeting Highlights:

11 members attended the November 8th Council meeting.

Treasurer's report:

- Our RBC investments lost \$2,898.11 in October.
- Donations from the congregation covered the entire cost of the parking lot lighting conversation.
- The 2021 operating budget is completed.
- Council approved the 2021 operating budget. It will be emailed to the congregation for approval.

• Pastor Leanne's report:

- Worship attendance remains good.
- \circ Staff reviews have been completed.
- Trustees approved the purchase of additional equipment to enhance the presentation of our virtual services and events.
- Virtual events are being planned for Advent.
- The book discussion on How to be Antiracist is completed and the group would like to continue with discussions, etc. Proposal that they develop a plan on Emmanuel becoming an intential Racial Justice Church.
- Participating in continuing education: Faith Change Leader, driving questions: what can we do with this church, with this mission, in this community at this time?

• Board reports:

- Christian Education: Plans are underway for a virtual Christmas Pageant and Wake Up With God.
- **Stewards**: The fall pledge drive has been put into motion.
- Social Concerns: Gift Bag project for homeless Veterans is underway. Awaiting information from Family Promise to arrange Christmas Gift buying for one small family for the Angel Tree Project.
- Trustees: Fall clean ups are complete, thank you to all who helped. Carpet cleaning is on hold for now. Salary increases for Jim and Donna were approved.
- **Pastoral Search:** The last survey from the Transition Team is being distributed to determine what qualities the congregation would like to see in a new pastor. The Team plans to have the Church Profile completed by the end of the year and have Council choose the Search Committee in January.
- 2021 Officers/Board Members: It was decided that Gary Phelps will be the Asst. Moderator and Sherri Krantz the Moderator (switching roles from 2020) and all other Boards/Committees would remain as is to get through this unusual time. Social Concerns will seek additional people for their Team and others will seek help with special projects as needed.
- Virtual Meetings: Council meetings will be virtual via Zoom going forward. We will strive to have very limited in-person meetings.
- The next Council meeting will be Sunday, December 13 at 10:45 AM via Zoom.
