Council met on Sunday, Zoom. Participants were: Jeannie Phelan, Sherri Krantz, Rev. Leanne Rose, Kathy Zebrowski,

Gary Phelps, Sue Stelling, Kristen Voskuil, Charlotte Voigt, Shirlene Hazelberg and Peggy Hazelberg.

Kathy gave the financial report: We continue to do OK financially. RBC investments improved in November, gaining \$16,009.58 for a total value of

\$212,996.17. Arrangements have been made with Ixonia Bank so that the Treasurers can access all the various church accounts and print statements since the bank will begin charging for paper statements. They will also begin paying bills online to save on postage costs.

Pastor Leanne reported that Advent cards (and bags w/cards & craft projects for families w/children or grandchildren) were delivered by herself, Jeannie Phelan, Jim Langreder and Donna Newland. Wednesday night Advent meditations are going well. Streaming worship services is improving. One of the cameras is causing issues and may need to be returned. She is thinking of ways we can expand connecting with the congregation. She is also exploring ways to have ongoing conversations on the subject of racial justice. Rev. Lorraine Ceniceros, our Conference Associate Minister will be our guest preacher on January 31 (not a vacation Sunday for Pastor Leanne). She is the person the Transition Team is working with in our search effort. Pastor Leanne along with Jeannie and Jim Langreder meet about every 6 weeks to plan worship music. Plans are in place through December. Open to ideas for Lent!! Online worship viewership remains good.

Peggy has sent out emails to the families regarding participating in the virtual Christmas Pageant. Families make their own videos and send them to Peggy to put together. Hopes to have it ready for the Dec. 20th worship service. If not, Christmas Eve, Christmas Day would be OK.

Sue Stelling and Charlotte Voigt reported for Stewards that as of Dec. 13th the pledge drive has yielded: GF -\$81,040.00 with 27 pledges collected; OCWM - \$2,480.00 with 8 pledges collected. Additional pledges continue to come in. The annual special UCC offering for The Christmas Fund will be December 20th.

Kristen is working on Usher Schedule for 2021 including asking ushers if they wish to continue since it will encompass both outdoor and hopefully eventually indoor services. For now, she is assigning one usher per Sunday and will amend as needed.

Peggy and Pastor Leanne reported that the Transition Team continues to work on our church profile and hopes to have it completed in January.

Shirlene reported that 23 Vet Bags and Family Promise gifts for one family were collected. Kathy Zebrowski and Sandie Horne will take the Vet Bags to the Veterans Hospital. Shirlene will take the Family Promise gifts to Waukesha on Monday.

Ken Pike sent in a written report for Trustees: Since we have officially determined we will not be having services this winter Tom has talked to our snow plowing contractor Brinkmann and they are willing to plow the driveway and only the first row of the parking lot for a reduced fee. Ron Blaschuk has sent out new procedures to the snow shoveling team, reducing the amount of work needed.

Council approved the Annual Meeting of the congregation will be held via Zoom on Sunday, January 31, 2021. Prior to that date, the Annual Report Booklet will be emailed out to the congregation. Boards and Committees should work on filling out their rosters by determining interest among the congregants in their particular mission within the church and approaching those people.

Council's next meeting will be Sunday, January 10, 2021 via Zoom.
