Reflection

As I write this in May, it's been a big month! As a world, vaccination numbers continue to grow while the number of COVID-19 cases decrease and we have started seeing the lower half of people's faces as we safely gather. As a congregation we have moved to indoor worship, with all the precautions that we can to keep each other safe and I am your settled pastor! It feels like a lot, although all these seem like good things that are moving us toward a world that we might recognize.

We are making transitions and we are making them quickly. We want so much to go back to the way things were before. But let's take a pause. The last year has revealed much about the world around us: discrepancies in health care and police responses, protests called riots and riots called protests, and Asian grandma's attacked.

In the book groups we've had together this past year, one question came up each time: What do we do now? As a church community, we have held onto the parts of who we are that make us Emmanuel--community, connection, support, generosity. What do we do now? We build on the foundation of who Emmanuel already is. We take one step at a time to grow, to reach out, to be a voice of love and compassion and justice for our neighbors.

And we do it together. This isn't the work of just your pastor, or the council, or the staff. We are the church together and we are building the future of Emmanuel on the firm foundation of all who have gone before us. We take who we are today, believing God has already given us everything we need for what comes next, and we take a leap into the unknown. It's a risk. IT's an adventure. It's going to take all of us. And I'm excited to be on this journey with VOU.

Family Promise News...

Thank You!

A special thank you for all those who helped us meet our goal of\$21,000 during our spring drive and "Giving Day" April 21. We

surpassed our goal and earned additional matching funds to help us continue to prevent or assist those in homelessness.

Family Promise Earned a Perfect Score from Charity Navigator

We recently received our eighth consecutive 4-star rating from Charity Navigator, a distinction given to only six percent of rated nonprofits. Charity Navigator evaluates charities and issues rated nonprofits a numeric score, based on financial health and governance practices, that is then used to generate a star rating. This year, Family Promise earned a perfect score of 100 out of 100 points, placing it among only 71 nonprofits across the nation to do so.

Apartment Shelter

Our 2 bedroom family apartment unit had a family move out in early May and a new family (single mom & 2 kids) move in the next day! If you are willing and able to help clean and ready this apartment as clients leave please let Jenna Spangler, Program Coordinator for Family Promise (262-968-2321) know.

We have one single woman living in our single women's shelter, with room for 2 more at most. As a reminder, the single women we serve will remain separate from the rotational shelter model and will not be sheltered in churches when we return to that.

Family Promise of Waukesha is initiating workshops next month in partnership with QPS Employment to provide any clients looking for work with resume writing help and interview prep assistance. The workshops will be open to the community as well!

Donations Needed

As we continue to temporality suspend the rotation model there are still needs to be filled. The following is a list of items that are needed:

Laundry detergent, dishwasher detergent, dish cloths, copy paper, paperclips, post-it-notes, rubber bands, file folders (colored or manila with left, right and middle tabs) regular and legal size notepads.

Any of these items can be dropped off in the church office and Sue Stelling or Charlotte Voigt will take them to the Day Center in Waukesha.

Council met on May 16th after Worship.

Treasurer's Report: Our financial picture continues to be excellent. RBC investment gain in April: \$6,992.31. Over \$1,800 has been collected for families in need to date.

Christian Education: The last Sunday School session will be May 23- games and party. There will be no official Sunday School over the summer. Melissa Rivera has volunteered to help with the children who are too young to attend worship. Will be meeting to make plans for the fall.

Stewards: The Strengthen the Church mission offering will be May 23, 2021. The group will meet soon to plan the calendar for the rest of the year.

Family Promise: They are doing well keeping families in their homes or providing temporary homes for them. The matching funds campaign from last month was a huge success...reached their goal. Churches will need to discuss reopening for rotation hosting when they are comfortable with it.

Trustees: Cleaning of the carpets throughout the church is completed with the exception of the Choir Room and Library which will be done later in the year. The total cost of renting the equipment and buying cleaner was \$338.83. The volunteer lawn service by a former member has not worked out so Tom Stelling and former member, Rod Podzsus are doing it. Tom also borrowed Bill Welch's sprayer and sprayed for dandelions. The furnace that services the church office (an original unit) is not working and will cost over \$600 to repair. A new unit will be \$2,400. Trustees will check to see what the cost of replacing the two remaining old units would be and will likely have it done. We have already had one service call on the other old unit this year. The cost of replacement will be covered by Capital Campaign funds. Western Lakes did a fire inspection this past week with no violations found.

Social Concerns: The Singing Bowl (for Family Promise) collected \$140 in April and \$25 in May to date. A meeting will be held with Shirlene, Jim Langreder, Sarah Erickson-Bhatt and Melissa Rivera to discuss new ideas for the future.

Pastor's Report: Nursing Homes and Assisted Living Centers are easing their rules, so she has been able to begin making visits to members who reside in those facilities. Two new members: retired pastor from Hartland/Genesee UCC churches Peter St. Martin and his wife, Judy have had their membership transferred to Emmanuel. The WI Conference Annual Meeting was held last week. Kristen Voskuil & Jim Langreder were delegates, representing Emmanuel. Pastor Leanne also 'attended.' The WI Conference has grant money available (made possible through Strengthen the Church donations) for visioning ideas. She is exploring different ideas (Theology on Tap). The deadline to apply for a grant is September 30, 2021.

The next meeting will be after Worship on June 27, 2021. This will be the meeting for both June and July.


