Although we are unable to provide shelter in our church for our Family Promise families as we have in the past, your generous donations of laundry products,

etc. were greatly appreciated. Thank you so much for being such a generous congregation.

We had a meeting with our FP Director, Joe, that included Pastor Leanne and Mother Pippa from St. Mary's Episcopal Church. We discussed the return of the church rotation model and in order to implement this program, we need to have all 26 churches on board.

Later in the year, we will be recruiting our volunteers and providing retraining with some new policies in place.
