Be the Church...Care for the Poor

As we continue our journey through the Bible, October will find us spending some time in the book of Exodus. Exodus tells the story of the Israelites, forced into slavery, set free, then going on the longest walk ever through the desert. What we see throughout the story is God noticed the people of Israel. God cared deeply for them, who they were, and where they were going. God gave them water when there was none. God sent birds to eat when food was scarce. God physically lead them to a land where agriculture would grow and animals would be able to graze.

God cares for those who had nothing by giving them what they need. When God gives them the outline for the kind of community they will form in that new land, God makes it a rule to care for the most vulnerable of their society by collecting money, leaving parts of the field unharvested, making them part of the community.

This is the tradition that Jesus grew up in, that formed who he was and what he called his disciples, and us, to do and be. We care for the vulnerable, those who are hungry, those without. We do what we can to offer what we can. It might be a gift card or a blanket to help refugees who came with little, and aren't prepared for Wisconsin winters. It might be giving cleaning supplies or a safe place to sleep working with Family Promise. We've even given to support God's animal creatures who need special care.

God revealed again and again that care for the poor and the vulnerable is a priority of what it means to be people of God. We care for folks by speaking up, writing letters to each other and politicians, giving of our time, talents, and resources. We care by looking out for each other that none are forgotten. Emmanuel Family, I celebrate all you do. I pray we continue to have eyes to see and hearts to care that we might notice and love those in need.

Family Promise of Waukesha County is developing a plan to return to the congregational model of shelter that will best serve families in need. They recently conducted a survey with the volunteers of all participating churches. They are monitoring the Covid-19 numbers and implementing strategies to protect families and volunteers.

The opening plan is still undergoing revisions, but will include a target date to reopen, strategies to keep families and volunteers safe, ways to promote the return, efforts to invite previous and new volunteers, orientations sessions.

Our Singing Bowl Ministry...We've had so many good causes this year for your generous Singing Bowl donations. In 2021 so far, we've raised \$379.48 for Family Promise as they work to help relieve families' housing insecurities during COVID. A Rome family lost their home due to an explosion after a gas leak, killing the husband, so in the month

of August we raised \$196.84 for them as the family tries to put their life back together after losing so much. On September $12^{\rm th}$, we raised \$57.22 for Wildlife in Need at our Blessing the Animals service.

Social Concerns is very excited about our new Singing Bowl cause, which began on September 5th -- helping Afghan refugees at Fort McCoy as they are being resettled in Wisconsin and other parts of the United States. Over 8,000 refugees are there currently with the possibility of many more.

The Federal Government provides each person with \$1,000 and eventually a Social Security card, English as a second language classes if needed and medical screening. Social Service agencies, such as Lutheran Social Services and Jewish Social Services are charged with finding residences with transit access, furnishing them, providing clothing, and stocking kitchens with a week's worth of culturally appropriate food. Most refugees have lost all belongings. These Social Service non-profits have previously helped maybe one refugee family a month but now are asked to facilitate services for so many more. Not since the Cuban Boat People Crisis in 1980 has Fort McCoy and service agencies seen anything like this.

It will be wonderful to, in some small way, help welcome these traumatized refugee families by raising money with our Singing Bowl, Thanks for your generous help!!!

Renaming of Pilgram Center Daycholah [dā-chō-lə]

On September 9, 2021, UCCI announced that our Outdoor Ministry site in Green Lake, Wisconsin, is being renamed. The new name is Daycholah Center. Daycholah is the original Ho-Chunk name for Green Lake.

This announcement comes because of a thorough process that involved many stakeholders, discussions, prayers, and a deep desire to reflect the mission and ministry of UCCI. This new name recognizes that this land was and remains a sacred place for Native Tribes. UCCI's Outdoor Ministry has a unique role and opportunity to restore the voice of Native Americans, acknowledge their stewardship of this sacred place, and begin a journey with this one small reparative step toward building strong, supportive, and sustained positive relationships with our indigenous siblings.

Our commitment to the sacred place that is Daycholah Center, and the community created when people gather there is not changing. Judnard Henry, Daycholah Center Managing Director, states it perfectly: "Renaming is an appropriate and necessary first step on our journey toward a future where all are welcome and included and have a voice. We will continue to grow as a sacred place of love, a sanctuary, a community of inclusion and belonging, a place to learn, and to connect more deeply to God and all others."

YOUR STORY HAS POWER

Following the success of MenHealing's recent collaborative storytelling event series, Voices of Healing: Trans & Nonbinary Survivors SPEAK OUT is a new collaborative effort between FORGE and MenHealing designed to support, uplift, and foster the resilience of trans and nonbinary survivors of sexual victimization. This project focuses on using creative expression to empower survivors to share their story, connect with others, and enhance healing for both themselves and the broader community.

The SPEAK OUT will showcase diverse stories of survivorship and healing from trans and nonbinary survivors who have experienced any kind of sexual victimization. We are seeking narratives that can be shared through multiple modalities, from spoken word to dance to song.

Trans and nonbinary survivors of all gender identities and experiences are encouraged to submit their pitches. 10 presenters will be selected to participate in a series of trauma-informed group workshops to hone their story in preparation of debuting their story to an online audience of supporters at two Premiere Events on March 31 and April 1, 2022.

Our aim is to create powerful public moments of resilience & dialogue that challenge the invisibility & isolation of trans & nonbinary survivors & build community.
