Be the Church...fight for the powerless

As you read this, perhaps you are already thinking about when you will have time to put away the Christmas tree, if you can get the lights taken down from outside before we have a heavy snow, and if the gifts have already been forgotten in the bluster of the New Year.

Often, it seems Christmas starts so early and it ends so abruptly as we transition into whatever comes next.

Which brings me to Howard Thurman. He was born in 1899 in one of Daytona, FL's three black families. Despite great loss in his family, despite the few options for education, despite society's the racism, Howard Thurman became Rev. Dr. Thurman, pastor, preacher, teacher, mystic. He studied non-violence with Ghandi and he taught it to Dr. King. He believed that the Good News of Jesus was to the disinherited, underprivileged, left behind, pushed aside, the powerless.

And we have a call to be people of Good News. We are called to share the Good News of God's love with all people. And that Good News has to be Good News for the people society leaves behind, the very kinds of people Jesus spent time with.

That Good News includes feeding the hungry, healing the sick, caring for the immigrant. That Good News includes asking something why they are hungry, sick, fleeing and seeking answers. The Good News includes seeing those society has left behind and speaking up, using whatever platform we have available to remind others they are still there, there is still a need, and there is we can do.

Nigeria is still in the middle of a war and there are still girls being kidnapped. There are LGBT+ people being arrested around the world. Muslims are being rounded into camps and killed. The children of cobalt miners-the element that makes rechargeable batteries–are being born with birth defects.

It is a lot. But you don't have to solve everything. Pick one, then use your voice, your platforms, your resources to raise awareness, to lift their stories, to fight for the powerless.

Dr. Thurman wrote:

When the song of the angels is stilled, when the star in the sky is gone, when the kings and princes are home, when the shepherds are back with their flocks, the work of Christmas begins: to find the lost, to heal the broken, to feed the hungry, to release the prisoner, to rebuild the nations. to bring peace among the people, to make music in the heart. Let us be of the world of Christmas all year long.

allowing the pain he was enduring to alter his friendly personality.

He founded John Quaden Dodge on January 1, 1966 in Okauchee, which later became Quaden Motors. He was a member of Wisconsin Masonic Lodge #315 in Dousman for over 50 years, where he was also a past Master. John was a well-respected businessman, and a wonderful person, and will be missed by all. He loved doing yard work at his home in Dousman and his lake home up north in Tomahawk. He enjoyed snowmobiling with family and friends.

Our prayers, love and sympathy continue for his family...his wife of 30 years, Karen and his four sons, John C. (Jo), James (Frida), Jerald, and Joel (Wendy); one grandson, Tanner; a brother-in-law, John Carey; as well as other relatives, friends and his beloved dog, Stevie.

John was preceded in death by his parents; his sister, Janet Carey; and his first wife, Carole (nee Wenzel), the mother of his four sons.

Thank you all for your continued prayers and support. This journey of discernment, learning and doing certainly has been life changing for me and my family.

I continue to be a chaplain intern at Aurora Lakeland and Burlington and have classes to go along with my learning. This

From Social Concerns...



Our collection for Afghanistan Refugees at Fort McCoy was very successful! We raised \$618 to help give families a new start here in America. Lutheran Social Services is the organization that is helping them get resettled.

Unfortunately, the Waukesha Christmas Parade tragedy was a tragedy too close to home. One reckless criminal act resulted in several deaths and many injured along with lots of children and families traumatized. We collected \$92 for the Waukesha Community Foundation to help those in need.

We now have been presented with another need in Waukesha and with a close connection to our congregation. Melanie Lauer's sister and brother-in-law, Beth and Scott Hastreiter, own one of the 48 units in the Horizon West Condo building that was evacuated by the Waukesha Fire Department on December 2nd because the building was deteriorating and in imminent threat of collapsing. The police came to their door and told them they had less than an hour to pack up and leave their home and were told to pack as if they would never be back. In the months before this event, Condo owners became aware that the building's balconies were unsafe and needed to be removed. This occurred, just days before the evacuation at the expense of each condo owner. Beth and Scott took out a second mortgage on their home to cover the \$12,000 in expenses to have theirs removed. They are only now being allowed back in

this week for 4 hours to remove any personal items they can.

Melanie tells us her sister and brother-in-law are the most kindhearted, thoughtful, and caring people she knows. You may remember last year we helped by bringing bottled water and easy to eat foods for the homeless that Melanie and Beth's families delivered, as they saw many in the City Park hungry and thirsty. The Homeless Day Centers, due to covid, were shut down on Sundays and the Hastreiter and Lauer families saw their need.

Thank you once again for opening your heart to needs in our community!





Thanks to all who volunteered to provide meals to our families in the Family Promise Shelter Program, purchased gifts or gift cards for the families that had tags on the Angel

Tree and donated winter clothing articles. We also want to thank those who contributed to the fundraising campaign. The final numbers are not in yet for this end of the year drive. In 2021, \$100,000 was used to help 44 families remain in their homes and to shelter 15 households.

Starting in the early spring of 2022, we hope to begin a different model of shelter. We will start with a static or stationary site which means we would be using only one church for our guests. The guests would not be moving every Sunday. As in the past, the host and support churches would take turns making meals but bring those meals to that designated church. We will be asking members of our congregation of their interest in volunteering. Retraining would take place. More information will follow.
