


March 2nd 6:30 PM

Experience Holy Friday from the perspective of those who watched Jesus die: Mary his mother; the Beloved Disciple from the Gospel of John; Mary Magdalene and the other women from Galilee; the two men, usually identified as thieves crucified with Jesus; the centurion and the soldiers; Joseph of Arimathea and Nicodemus. Jews Romans, friends and and strangers, the powerful and the powerless, the hopeful and the despairing.

We will engage in this intriguing study with other area UCC congregations...each in our own church buildings via Zoom. We will begin with prayer and a brief video and then have conversation about the material. This will be a great opportunity to explore the story and to meet with other congregations in our area. One of the ways we stay connected to those who are no longer able to attend Worship and other events in person is by sending them a weekly newsy letter along with a copy of the previous Sunday's bulletin and sermon.
