Our culture, for generations, has been pushing for an increasingly individualistic view of the world. It teaches us to prioritize ourselves (this might include our immediate family) above all others, that we should be able to make it on our own (and we have failed if we can't), and that our lives are distinct from each other. The results are pitting individuals and groups against each other by class, race, region, and generations.

The church presents a different view of the world. One that is counter to the culture but might be more instinctual—we need each other. We are communal people. We need interaction, connection, affirmation. We need support in difficult times and need to be useful when we're able. We need to be challenged so we can continue to grow and learn.

We need to see people who have made it, and hear their stories. The church is one of (perhaps the only) intentionally inter-generational gatherings of non-familial people. Where else do you see elementary school age kids talking with those from the builder generation where the elder isn't in a teaching position or a grandparent? Where everyone can share a story and be heard and appreciated?

The church is place where young people have learned leadership, practiced their talents (so many singers started in church), and found their voice. All of those things we hope our young people learn in all their activities can be learned in the church when everyone is invested.

Yes, it takes showing up. It's our young people showing up to practice service, mission, forgiveness, and community. And it's everyone else showing up for service, mission, forgiveness, and community. It's showing up to invest time, and energy, conversation in young people. It means choosing learning and growth of everyone over expedience. Things may take longer, but if the point is connection, time isn't an issue.

When someone, no matter what age, is part of a community that cares about them, that misses them when they are gone (and reaches out), that values their thoughts and opinions, trusts them with stories and responsibilities, and gives them meaning and opportunities, they will stay connected. This is what building the beloved community, the church is all about.

What can we do? Show up on Sundays and other days. Connect with someone in a different generation than you–learn their names, stories, share yours–and invite them. Maybe you can price rummage sale items or sell hot dogs together! Maybe you could teach Sunday school once a month or once a guarter.

People need beloved communities and the world needs more positive connection.



### Messy Church August 14th

These are relaxed, enjoyable services. If you haven't had an opportunity to attend one yet, mark your calendar for August 14<sup>th</sup>.



Congratulations on your generosity! We raised a little over \$407 for the National Alliance for the Mentally III (NAMI), our local chapter in Waukesha. It's a great feeling

that our contribution might help a family or individual that is experiencing difficulties with mental health. NAMI has so many free counseling services and support groups that are free to those who need them. Not worrying about financial costs for services has got to be a good thing with all the other stressors.

For July and August, we are supporting Everytown for Gun Safety, one of the top rated organizations working for SAFETY for homes, schools, and public settings. With all the senseless shootings in the news, it's hard not to feel overwhelmed but aren't we called as Christians to not give up hope and strive for social justice for everyone. This group has joined together Moms Demand Action (700 groups nationwide), Students Demand Action (400 groups nationwide), Mayors against Illegal Guns (2,000 groups nationwide) and Survivors Network (connecting survivors of gun violence to support other victims and to become gun safety advocates)

Here are a few facts about safety in our state: Wisconsin has no law requiring background checks on unlicensed gun sales. The existing state laws prohibiting domestic abusers from possessing guns are dangerously incomplete. Wisconsin also has no Extreme Risk law to allow family members and law enforcement to petition for the removal of guns from dangerous situations. In Wisconsin, 641 people die by guns every year. To become a safer state, Wisconsin can enact a law requiring background checks on all gun sales, enact an Extreme Risk law, and strengthen its laws keeping guns away from domestic abusers.

Please help by contacting your legislator and/or contributing to our Singing Bowl if you can. Thanks as always to a compassionate congregation.

One of the families in the program was able to save enough to have a cushion of two months' rent and has moved out of the program after finding a job and a home. She and her 3 children have been homeless for a year, living with friends, family and shelters. Imagine her excitement!

The sign-up for making a meal filled up quickly in July. Thanks to all who participated. If you didn't have a chance to help in this mission - plan ahead. Our next rotation for meals will be in October.


