In the life of the church, our Sunday morning worship is a place where we can land once a week to connect to God and each other, rest from the work of the week, reflect on our actions and inactions, and grow and prepare ourselves for whatever is coming next. In that way, Sunday morning is important, although not the only important part of being church.

The prayers and responsive readings during the service is called the *liturgy* which translates to "the work of the people." When we gather on Sunday mornings, we are practicing the liturgy, the work of the people, in how we practice apologizing and forgiveness, how we de-centralize ourselves and see how we are connected to the web of being in the world, how we break bread and enjoy a meal together, and how we share who we are and what is important to us.

If worship is how we practice the work we do in the world, then there are 2 truths I've been thinking about:

1: There is a place for everyone to bring who they are, their gifts, their creativity, their knick-knacks, their ideas.

2: It doesn't have to be perfect. It is a practice and we believe that everyone is always becoming and growing and changing. You can bring your unformed ideas to be rolled around and expanded, your first attempts at art or forgiveness, your broken pieces of relationships and bowls, your quilt where the comers don't meet perfectly or your voice that joyfully doesn't quite find the pitch. It is all welcome and it is holy and it is imperfect.

This fall, we're going to be trying some things. You may notice changes in the shape of the sanctuary chairs, in where people "normally" are, in what is happening with the space in the back. You may notice craft projects you can do, art others have done, or representations of each week's scripture on shelves or in the front.

And you can be part of that!

You can bring your art (on theme or not), your crafts, and your hats for missions to share with the community.

Each week has a theme, with some suggested ideas that could decorate the altar. Then your creativity can be free to add what you're thinking about, what you have to share, where God is working in your life!

And it doesn't have to be perfect. It just needs to be our offerings, blessings, and work in the practice of worship and life.

Title: Elements of Interpretation

When and how do you learn new things? Or learn a new way of thinking about something old? Who or what teaches you? Who are some teachers that influenced you?

What in your life has influenced how you read or hear Bible stories? What books do you read to learn about the world, yourself, God? What has changed your mind about how you thought about something?

Books, images, etc with new ideas, learnings, or interpretations.

#### October 22 2 Samuel 5:1-5: 6:1-5: Psalm 150

David Anointed King: David becomes king over all Israel. Brings the Ark of the covenant to Jerusalem with song making Jerusalem a place of worship.

Title: Elements of Praise

Regardless of style though, I strongly believe in music's power to help direct our hearts toward God and bring about God's mission of bringing love to the world. I am very grateful to be here among you all, and I'd like to thank everyone for being so welcoming during my first few months here.



Our Singing Bowl donations for August and September are being collected for Mukwonago Food Pantry. So far we have a little over \$150 donated, and the Food Pantry has resources to use our dollars to buy as much as \$450

worth of items. When we help seniors and families that are hungry and food insecure, it frees up money for them to buy medicine, pay utilities and for housing without jeopardizing their health. Also, we are collecting Men and Women's Body Wash and Deodorant. If you can pick up some product and drop it off in the Office, it would be very much appreciated as Food Pantry is very low on these hygiene products. Thank you.

For October, we will be supporting local organization Wildlife In Need located on Waterville Road. Their mission is the treatment and care of injured, diseased, or orphaned indigenous wildlife, and the subsequent return of healthy viable animals to appropriate habitats in the wild. At the Wildlife In Need Center (WINC) they answer over 10,000 phone calls from people asking for advice or help with wildlife issues. Of the 3,000 animals admitted annually for care, 85% of these animals were admitted because of interactions with humans. They also conduct educational programs in schools and for scouts, church, and civic groups.

The Center is run primarily by volunteers and a very small staff, operating 365 days a year. WINC receives no county, state, or federal funding. WINC operates entirely through fundraising efforts along with the generosity of passionate donors, but also from corporate foundations and private foundation grants.



A successful supplies drive was held two weeks in September for the Community Shelter. From April to August the shelter has served 19 families including 23 adults and 42

children. Thank you for providing needed articles for the clients and the shelter in Waukesha.

Our Homeless Prevention Program was awarded a grant for \$20,000 in July. These monies will be used for rent assistance to prevent family homelessness in our county. Crystal, a former client, was someone who benefitted from financial assistance through Family Promise. Listen to her story by going to familypromisewaukeshawi.org.

Family Promise of Waukesha County will be participating in the community event, Project Homeless Connect (PHC), October 26 from 10 A.M. to 3:00 P.M. at Carroll University. This event includes health screenings, dental and vision exams, haircuts, lunch and a resource fair. There will also be hygiene and cold weather items available. If your company would like to be a sponsor, if you would like to make a donation or would like to volunteer at the event go to unitedwaygmwc.org for more information.

Thank you for the part you have played in making Family Promise an organization that has helped so many families have hope when they found their situation was bleak.
