with disabilities to acquire life-long skills that will enable them to become contributing and valued members within their communities. They provide adaptive recreation, education, enrichment, and community service. They are located in Waukesha and besides providing adult daycare, there are opportunities for clients to express themselves artistically such as at Art Links 333, the ACAP Players for theater, and Lifestriders with horse care. There are many events and ways we can support this charity, but our dollars and cents collected in December will be very much needed.
