

As most of you know we have been talking about moving to North Carolina for some time. Well, it's finally going to happen! November 19th is moving day. It has been a long journey with many bumps in the road. Many of you have said to us we don't know how you do it! Our response is we don't know how we would have done it without the support of our church family, the cards, words of encouragement, prayers and offers of help.

Our last Sunday will be Nov 5th and we would like to invite <u>all of you</u> to a light lunch following worship. We plan on continuing to attend services online so it's not to say goodbye but to say THANK YOU for all you have done. Just remember to turn to the camera and wave to us occasionally.

Congratulations again on your generosity! We raised \$240.00 for the Mukwonago Food Pantry and collected 34 generous sized Men and Women's Body Washes and Deodorants, which was very much needed as Food Pantry was very low on

these hygiene products. Thank you.

The month of October we've been supporting the local organization Wildlife In Need located on Waterville Road. Their mission is the treatment and care of injured, diseased, or orphaned indigenous wildlife, and the subsequent return of healthy viable animals to appropriate habitats in the wild. At the Wildlife In Need Center (WINC) they answer over 10,000 phone calls from people asking for advice or help with wildlife issues. Of the 3,000 animals admitted annually for care, 85% of these animals were admitted because of interactions with humans. They also conduct educational programs in schools and for scouts, church, and civic groups.

For November, our charity will be Adaptive Community Approach Program (ACAP). ACAP's mission is to encourage people with disabilities to achieve their highest potential and to acquire life-long skills that will enable them to become contributing and valued members within their communities. They do this through adaptive recreation, education, enrichment, and community service. They are located in Waukesha and besides providing adult daycare, there are opportunities for clients to express themselves artistically. ACAP has an art studio on Main Street, Art Links 333, where clients can make their art and sell it to the public. They work with Waukesha Civic Theater to do shows as the ACAP Players. They have a collaboration with Lifestriders for clients to work with therapy horses and learn to care for them. ACAP has lots of opportunities for adults with disabilities to be out in the community. There are many events and ways we can support this charity, but our dollars and cents collected in November will be very much needed.



From April to October we have been using the facilities of the Housing Action Coalition for our families in need of shelter. Starting in November we will be partnering with

Hebron House to run the Waukesha Winter overflow shelter in the same facility. One side of the shelter will house our families while the other side will house single men and women. Meals for the families will be served at different times than those for the single people. With this change comes a change in how we participate in providing meals. Emmanuel hopes to join with another partner who may request us to assist them in providing part of a meal once a month.

If you are willing to be called upon for this task, please contact Emmanuel's Volunteer Coordinators, Sue Stelling, Shirlene Hazelberg or Charlotte Voigt so that we may add your name to the list of available volunteers to provide part of a meal. We also need volunteers to serve the meal from 5 P.M. – 8 P.M. You must complete a training

course if you are interested in that. Talk to the coordinators for further information.

Thank you for your gift of \$25 via Check received on 10/13/23. Your generosity will prevent families from losing their home through financial assistance for rent, utilities or car repairs; or provide them an

opportunity for a new beginning in our shelter program.

In 2022, gifts provided assistance to 95 households and 316 individuals. These are families who either were able to avoid the chaos of homelessness or were provided shelter and given an opportunity to escape homelessness. 68% of families who completed the shelter program were able to exit to independent, permanent housing. 93% of households we assisted with rent assistance remain in their home.

It is because of your compassion and kindness that these families have another opportunity.


