Theme until Lent: Asking the Questions

- 1/7: Mark 1:21-45 New Beginnings Jesus heals a man with an unclean spirit, Peter's mother-in-law, and a leper.--This is the first story of Jesus healing someone. What does healing mean to you? Ideas: healing: Frist Aid Kit, things you used when you were injured, oil,
- 1/14 Mark 2:1-22 New Wine Jesus heals a paralytic and eats with tax collectors.--The paralyzed man is almost unable to meet Jesus. What keeps you from faith? actions? going to a place? Ideas: Barriers, stop signs, caution tape
- 1/21 Mark 4:1-34 New Growth Parables of sower and mustard seed—Jesus tells lots of stories that are centered around planting and growing things, and the people and animals that interact with them. What helps you understand Jesus' stories and world? What images do you have when you read the stories? Ideas: bulbs, seeds, pots, weeds, mustard, yellow things
- 1/28 Mark 5:1-20 New ___?__ Jesus heals the Gerasene demoniac—It's a little scary out there. Ideas: cemetery, Halloween? Pigs?
- 2/4 Mark 5:21-43 New Life Jesus heals Jairus' daughter and the woman with the flow of blood.--These are some stories about women. An unnamed woman has been suffering for years with uncontrollable bleeding. Let's bring menstrual supplies for our local food bank.
- 2/11 Mark 8:27—9:8 New Perspective Peter's confession, passion prediction, bearing the cross, Transfiguration—Symbolizing Jesus' question: 'Who do you say I am?' And the many questions the

disciples had about him. Ideas: How do you get ready for Lent? What is something you question? Do you have a question mark? Can you make one?
