We're also going to hear more and more about how divided, isolated, "in our own camps" we have become as a society. We will probably feel it in our community with yard signs, bumper stickers, and comments in stores.

It has become a mark of pride to dig one's feet into an opinion or fact you learned once, and never let any new information change our minds. Some of it is silly and metaphorical, like, a frog thrown into a boiling pot of water would surely die and one slow heated does, in fact, feel the heat and jump out. But the metaphor is so good, that perhaps we never questioned it.

Our ideas, opinions, the things we KNOW, sometimes we hold on to them so tightly that we cannot hear another's opinions or experience, we cannot learn, and we cannot grow. It can break down families, friendships, and communities.

But could we find a way to hear each other, learn together, build community, and be more united, even through this political season?

During Lent, you're invited to read and discuss *Think* Again by Adam Grant. In it, Grant proposes that intelligence ought not to be fixed but thinking and rethinking our views. That mental flexibility, humility, and curiosity are vital to our lives together. "If knowledge is power, knowing what we don't know is wisdom."

In the spring, Emmanuel and St Mary's will host discussions for the larger Dousman/Lake Country community, so that we might all be more open to conversations, discussion, learning from each other, and rethinking.

Remembering MaryEllen Jondle...

On December 23rd, one day after her 102nd birthday, MaryEllen went home to be with God.

MaryEllen came to us in 2018 when she moved from Florida to live with her son and daughter-in-law, Ned and Dawn Jondle.

Many of us did not have the opportunity to get well

acquainted with MaryEllen, and now knowing her life's story, that is truly a shame...we missed out!

She was born in Minnesota on December 22, 1921. Her family moved to North Dakota after the Great Depression, and ultimately ended up back in Ladysmith, WI. She attended Superior State Teacher's College and while student teaching, she met and fell in love with Ralph Jondle. They married in 1944 and moved to California where Ralph worked on welding gun turrets to B-17's and MaryEllen worked as Rosie the Riveter.

They returned to Wisconsin after WWII and settled in West Allis, ultimately, both involved in teaching careers. Not surprisingly, parents requested MaryEllen as their children's kindergarten teacher. She made learning fun with her creativity and youthful spirit.

It's hard to say what MaryEllen's passions were...there seems to have been many. She was a lifelong artist, mostly self-taught. She crafted, sewed, knitted sweaters (the gorgeous sweaters she wore to church were made by her hands), made cards, diamond art, painting and woodworking. She also was an avid traveler. From the time her family was young, they went camping all around the country. Being teachers, MaryEllen and Ralph had their summers free and they used that free time well. Her travels also took her to Mexico, Central American, China, Russia, India, Africa and all over Europe.

After retiring from teaching, MaryEllen and Ralph wintered in Florida before deciding to settle there full time. After almost 20 years of retirement, they went to work part time at Disney World, which they really enjoyed. MaryEllen took 88 Disney cruises. Her goal was to go on her 100th cruise on her 100th birthday. She would have likely made if the Covid pandemic had not happened.

This lovely lady was an inspiration...May she rest in peace....we will miss you MaryEllen!
