It's full of narratives, poetry, songs. It tells the stories of lovers and siblings and violence and survival and hope. It tells stories of what it means to be human.



It's why we can spend part of our summer on the Gospel of Broadway. Because West Side Story taught us about love, hate, and forgiveness. Because South Pacific proclaimed that we have to be carefully taught to hate, fear, and discriminate. Because Newies reminds us that together we can fight the powers. Because there is truth and hope in these stories that remind us what it is to be human.

Composers and songwriter are the poets who are trying to understand the world around us, who are holding a mirror to the lives we live, who are painting an image of what could be. They help us understand ourselves and the world God created.
