Prior to the 1930s, the mainline, Protestant, US Christian church, including the denominations from which the UCC would come, tended to be pro-union and many clergy were members of the socialist party. Unions were for the collective, good for the workers, and left no one behind, all would rise together. The New Deal reforms coming out of the Great Depression sought to put many of those ideals into national policy.

Know who wasn't a fan of unions or the New Deal? The National Association of Manufacturers. They made it their mission to turn public opinion from unions toward laser faire capitalism. The NAM decided or realized the way to the public was through religion and clergy. They found their real opening in equating socialism and unions with the great enemy of the end of the 20th century–communism.

Slowly, collectivism, the lifting up of all, leaving none behind, became an idea of ancient Christianity and not an ideal toward which we ought to strive.

Fannie Lou Hamer noted that "nobody's free until everybody is free," and Rev. Dr. King wrote, "Injustice anywhere is a threat to justice everywhere."

When Jesus healed, he reconciled folks back into community. When he gave rituals, they were for a community. As churches grew, they were communities of mutual aid and support that cared for the outcast and left no one behind.

Juneteenth marks that day when the Union army marched into Galveston Bay, TX to put into effect the Emancipation that had been declared a year and a half earlier, leaving no one behind.

Juneteenth continues to be a celebrated as a day of collective liberation and a day that reminds us there is still liberty to fight for–not all have been lifted up.

As people and part of a tradition that has individualized freedom and perpetuated structures of oppression, it is vital that all, and we, remember Juneteenth as a celebration and a call to action to see, name, expose, and fight against the forces and powers of violence and oppression that seek to keep us looking at ourselves and not a "we." "Nobody is free until everybody is free."
