As we enter the season of Advent, we are invited into a sacred space of waiting, watching, and anticipating. It's a time when our hearts are stirred with longing—not only for the celebration of Christ's first coming, but also for His promised return. This year, as we prepare for the arrival of the Christ Child, we reflect on how Advent invites us to dream, to see visions, and to hold on to hope in the midst of life's uncertainties.

Dreams and Visions in Advent

This Advent season of anticipation and expectation, is a time when we recall the dreams and visions that shaped the story of Jesus' birth. In the visions of the prophets and to the angelic announcements to Mary and the shepherds, God's plan for the world unfolded in extraordinary ways through dreams and visions.

These dreams and visions remind us that God is always at work in our lives, revealing plans in ways we might not expect. Advent is a time to reflect on what dreams and visions God is stirring in us, and how we can respond in faith, just as Mary and the prophets did.

Advent invites us to dream with God—asking what God might be calling us to in this season. Just as God gave vision that altered the course of Mary's life, God continues to call each of us to a higher purpose and a greater vision. Maybe it's a dream of reconciliation, a vision of justice, or a calling to love your neighbor in a new way. Advent asks us to seek God's direction, to listen to God's still, small voice, and to be open to the dreams God plants in our hearts.

We are also invited to see the world through God's eyes. Advent helps us look at the world with renewed vision, seeing both the brokenness and the beauty, the pain and the hope, and understanding that Christ has come to heal and restore. The light of Advent illuminates the places in our lives that need transformation, and as we wait for the fullness of God's kingdom, we are called to bring glimpses of His kingdom here on earth through acts of love, kindness, and justice.

Ways to Engage with Dreams, Visions, and Hope This Advent

- Reflect on God's Visions: Take time each week to meditate on a vision from scripture that speaks to you. How does God's vision for the world challenge or inspire your own? Ask God to give you a fresh vision for how you can be His hands and feet in the world today.
- Hold onto Hope: In a season that can feel stressful or overwhelming, focus on holding onto hope. Consider starting an Advent tradition of writing down what you are hopeful for each week, praying over those hopes, and seeing how God works in your life as you wait in expectation.
- Dream Big: Allow yourself to dream with God. What does it look like for you to live fully in His purpose for your life? How might He be calling you to step out in faith this Advent? Take time to journal, pray, or talk with a trusted friend about the dreams God is placing in your heart.
- Share the Light: Advent reminds us that the hope of Christ is for the world. Look for ways to share that hope with others—whether it's through acts of kindness, words of encouragement, or simple prayers for those who are struggling.

May your Advent be filled with new dreams, renewed visions, and an unshakable hope in the One who has come, who is coming again, and who is with us even now.

Some of them did it for less money than they could easily live on. They did this because of what they believe who God is, and what they believe about who we are.

For all the sacrifices that clergy and lay church workers have made in our congregations the UCC Pension Board created the Christmas Fund for the Veterans of the Cross and the Emergency Fund, to help support them in retirement and during times of emergency need.

The Christmas Fund provides Supplementation of Small Annuities, Supplementation of Health Premiums, Emergency Grants, and Christmas "Thank You" Gift Checks for retirees and those facing unforeseen financial hardship.

For over 100 years, The Christmas Fund has provided direct this financial assistance to the healers in our lives: retired and active UCC ministers, church workers, and their families. In 2023, over 1,800 congregations joined together to secure the physical, financial, and spiritual health of those engaged in the life of the church.

On Friday, October 25th some of our members helped Family Promise celebrate 10 years of providing support to families experiencing homelessness. It was a fun night of trivia games, reminiscing, and

meeting old friends. The highlight of the evening was hearing a testimonial from one of our guests, Michelle. She and her daughter had lost their home in 2018 and found their way to Family Promise. Thanks to the help that she received from Family Promise, Michelle now has her own home, a college degree and her own catering business.



This winter (December 16 – February 15) Family Promise plans to reopen the Emergency Overflow Center in Waukesha, which is owned by the Housing Action Coalition. The shelter will be open overnight from 7 PM to 7 AM and Hebron Housing Services will provide the overnight staff. During the day, single adults will be transported to the Hope Center and families to the Family Promise Day Center. Volunteers are needed to offer support and care during day at the Center.

Volunteers are needed to provide a meal either at the EOS facility or the Day Center at 5:30 PM. The meal will be of your choosing and provided whenever available. Volunteers are also needed to provide transportation using the transit van at approximately 7 AM and 5:30 PM. Please contact Sue Stelling if your are able to volunteer for any of these needs. Lake Country Caring...In October and November, our Singing Bowl donations have been dedicated to Lake Country Caring in Hartland. This organization provides donated clothing, hygiene

products, furniture, appliances, infant and household items to those in need. These items and community resource referral are provided to an average of 350 people each month who live in Waukesha, Washington, Dodge or Jefferson County.

UCC Disaster Relief Fund...For December and January, the Singing Bowl donations will be collected for the UCC Disaster Relief Fund. Some of the areas our donations will be to support needs such as:

Hawaii Wildfires -- When natural disasters and other crises upend lives locally or forcibly displace people from their homes, the fund aids local relief efforts and bridges the gaps in existing resources for long-term community revitalization.

Ukraine -- Gifts made to UCC Ukraine Relief Fund will provide shelter, food, and other care to war refugees and internally displaced people. It also will help refugees and asylum seekers from African, Middle Eastern and other countries who had sought refuge in Ukraine and now are twice displaced, as well as other citizens of more than 125 countries living in Ukraine.

Middle East Support --- With ecumenical partners, the UCC has offered a public witness that has been unequivocal: Condemnation of the violence of Hamas and Israel's use of force against Palestinians in Gaza— A call for a cease-fire — The allowance of the provision of humanitarian aid for Palestinians and an end to collective punishment -- The guarantee of and respect for safe spaces for people to find shelter and — Support for robust diplomatic efforts to resolve the core issues.

USA Weather Emergencies/Hurricane Relief -- The National Ministries of the United Church of Christ has a long history of supporting communities as they recover from disaster and their plight fades from the headlines. Your support of this appeal will ensure that communities are supported and accompanied for years as they rebuild. Uniting in prayer, action, and giving, we stand as a people of faith in love and compassion. There are many humanitarian concerns in the world today so please help by contributing to our Singing Bowl if you can.

We are a small but generous congregation. When asked, we give of our talents, time and gifts. This proved true as we held our yearly pledge drive. "Mystery of the Christmas Star" is a journey back 2000 years to

Bethlehem seeking to discover a scientific explanation for the Star the wise men followed to find the baby Jesus. They will investigate possible dates for the birth of Christ, and look at recorded sightings of significant astronomical events during this time frame, trying to determine which of these signs in the sky could have been remarkable enough to cause the wise men to travel across the desert from Babylon to Bethlehem just to see a newborn King.

"Mystery of the Christmas Star" is already a part of their public show schedule for Saturday, December 7th, 14th and 21st at 1 PM and Wednesday, December 18 at 11 AM. Tickets are needed, but their cost is minimal.
