#### Call to Covenant and Community

As we stand at the beginning of a new year, the invitation to start anew with God's guidance is a profound opportunity. It is a time to reflect, realign, and renew our commitment to God's call in our lives. One powerful tradition for the new year is the **Covenant Prayer of John Wesley**, which encourages personal renewal and a deeper commitment to God's purpose.

The Covenant Prayer is a prayer of total surrender to God's will. It is a prayer rooted in the life and ministry of John Wesley, who believed that each new year provided a moment to reflect on our relationship with God and renew our commitment to live according to the call of Christ. Wesley's Covenant Prayer begins with a profound declaration: "I am no longer my own, but yours." This simple statement acknowledges the central truth of the Christian life: we are not our own. We belong to God, who created us, sustains us, and walks alongside us in every season of life.

While the Covenant Prayer is often prayed individually, its deep connection to community is undeniable. As Christians, we are not isolated in our journey of faith. We are part of the body of Christ, a community called to live in mutual love and service. When we pray this prayer, we do so not just for ourselves, but as part of the larger community of believers. The prayer's themes of surrender and submission speak not only to our individual lives, but to our life together as a church.

In community, we share in each other's joys and burdens. We encourage one another to walk in God's will and challenge each other to live out our faith more fully. The Covenant Prayer invites us to serve God together, as a body united in purpose, knowing that our individual commitments shape the collective life of the church and how we live in the world.

John Wesley's Covenant Prayer:

"I am no longer my own, but yours.

Put me to what you will, rank me with whom you will.

Put me to doing, put me to suffering.

Let me be employed for you or laid aside for you,

Exalted for you or brought low for you.

Let me be full, let me be empty.

Let me have all things, let me have nothing.

I freely and heartily yield all things to your pleasure and disposal.

And now, O glorious and blessed God, Creator, Savior, and Sustainer,

You are mine, and I am yours. So be it.

And the covenant which I have made on earth, let it be ratified in heaven. Amen."

These words are a profound invitation to live with open hands before God, ready to follow where God leads—whether in times of abundance or lack, success or suffering. As we offer ourselves to God in this way, we remember that this surrender is not only personal but shared. Our commitment to God's will also means living out His love and grace in community, supporting one another, and growing together in faith.

In the new year, we are called not only to surrender ourselves to God's will but also to embrace our role in the community of believers. God's purpose for our lives is never isolated from the larger mission of the church. Each of us has a part to play in the body of Christ, whether through service, prayer, teaching, or simply being present for one another in times of joy and sorrow.

The new year provides us with an opportunity to reflect on how we can more fully live out our covenant with God in community. How can we encourage one another? How can we serve one another? How can we pray for one another and walk alongside each other as we seek to follow Christ? The Covenant Prayer challenges us to live not just for our own good, but for the good of the entire body of Christ.

As we begin this new year, let us remember that we are part of something larger than ourselves. We are part of a community that is called to live in love, to serve one another, and to seek God's will above all else. The Covenant Prayer reminds us that our commitment to God is also a commitment to each other. Let us walk forward into this new year, united in purpose and faith, trusting that God will lead us every step of the way.

Happy New Year, and may you experience God's peace and presence in every moment of the year ahead!




