## Pastor Leanne's Message...

### A Season of Unfolding:

April is a month that refuses to stay still. It's a bridge between the deep sleep of winter and the vibrant exhale of spring. For us, it serves as a living metaphor for the Resurrection—a reminder that life doesn't just return; it transforms.

### The Power of the "Push"

New life is rarely quiet or effortless. Think of a seed beneath the soil: for it to become a flower, it must first undergo a complete breakdown of its former self. It has to push through the weight of the earth to find the light.

In our own lives, liberation often feels the same way. We may be pushing through seasons of grief, habits that no longer serve us, or the "winter" of a quiet spirit. But the message of the empty tomb is clear: The weight of the earth cannot hold back the promise of the Bloom.

### Living the Resurrection

How do we practice "New Life" in our daily routines this month?

Release the Old: Liberation starts with letting go. What "winter" thoughts or grudges are you still carrying into the spring?

Notice the Small Gains: New life starts as a tiny green shoot, not a full-grown garden. Celebrate the small steps of growth in your faith and your relationships.

Be the Sunlight: Just as the sun draws life from the ground, our encouragement can help others find their own strength to grow.

### A Reflection for the Month

"He is not here; he has risen, just as he said."  
 — Matthew 28:6

As the rain falls and the flowers begin to peek through the soil this April, take a moment to breathe in the fresh air of grace. You are not stuck in yesterday. You are part of a continuous, beautiful unfolding.

### Breaking the Silence: A Call to Light and Healing

In the quiet of our sanctuary, we often seek peace. But for many, silence isn't peaceful—it is a cage. Statistics tell us that domestic and sexual violence affect people in every zip code, every social class, and every pew.

For too long, the church has stayed silent on these "difficult" topics, unintentionally signaling to survivors that their pain is not welcome here. This month, we are changing that.

### Acknowledging the Timeline of Trauma

We recognize that the "silence" we are breaking isn't the same for everyone. Violence and abuse do not follow a standard calendar, and healing doesn't have an expiration date.

Current Struggles: For some in our midst, the crisis is happening right now. We want you to know that you are seen, you are believed, and you do not have to navigate the darkness alone.

Echoes from the Past: For others, the violation may have happened decades ago. Perhaps it was a childhood experience or a past relationship that still casts a shadow over your present. Whether a wound is fresh or has been carried for a lifetime, it is worthy of our prayers, our witness, and God's restorative touch.

### Why We Are "Breaking the Silence"

Our upcoming worship service is a theological statement that God is present in every chapter of our stories. We believe that:

Healing requires truth: We cannot address what we refuse to name.

Justice is a spiritual practice: Supporting survivors is at the heart of the Gospel call to love our neighbors.

The Church should be the safest place on earth: By educating ourselves, we ensure our community is a sanctuary of protection, not a hiding place for harm.

What to Expect: This service will be one of lament, hope, and solidarity. We will honor the resilience of survivors of all ages, pray for those still in harm's way, and commit ourselves to being a community that listens without judgment.

**Lake Country Free Clinic**

Our Singing Bowl for January, February and March raised \$313 so far for the Lake Country Free Clinic in Oconomowoc. This money will help support people

without dependable health insurance. This organization is celebrating 25 years of service for those in need of medical, pharmaceutical and dental services. They provided care for 109,000 client visits last year. The clinic offers their services to adults in Waukesha County and children in Oconomowoc School District.

**Milwaukee Homeless Veteran Initiative**

Our Singing Bowl for April and May will be Milwaukee Homeless Veterans Initiative. This non-profit, run completely by Veterans and donations, provides the services that homeless and at-risk veterans need to reach and maintain their highest level of independence. Founded and run by veterans, they offer unique programs to fill the gaps and don't duplicate what others do. Programs include: Outreach, Case Management, Emergency Food, Home Support, Women's Veterans Initiative, and Bikes for Stripes. When possible, they partner with the Veterans Administration, Wis. Dept. of Veterans Affairs, County Veterans Service Officers, and other non-profit agencies. Since 2008, they have served thousands of veterans and their families in Southeastern Wisconsin. Their motto is "We don't leave our wounded behind." Our donations to this organization will be a wonderful memorial to Debbie Morgan's son, Casey, who was very involved in this cause.
